"The American Book Review" is an internationally circulated literary publication with a 30-year history. It often focuses on high-quality literary works from small or university presses neglected by mass media. The review comes out six times a year. "Symplok" is a peer-reviewed scholarly journal of comparative theory and literature. Writers examine a common theme through various disciplines and scholarly backgrounds. The journal is particularly interested in interdisciplinary studies and the intermingling of philosophy, literature, cultural criticism and intellectual history.
